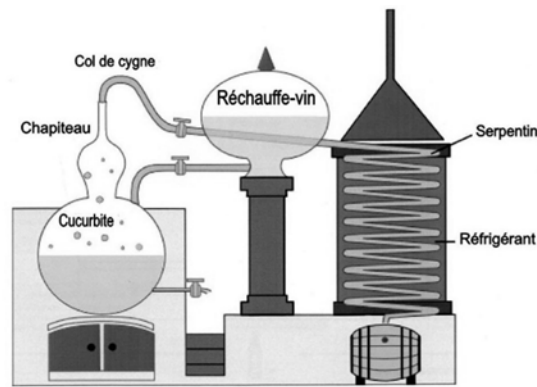
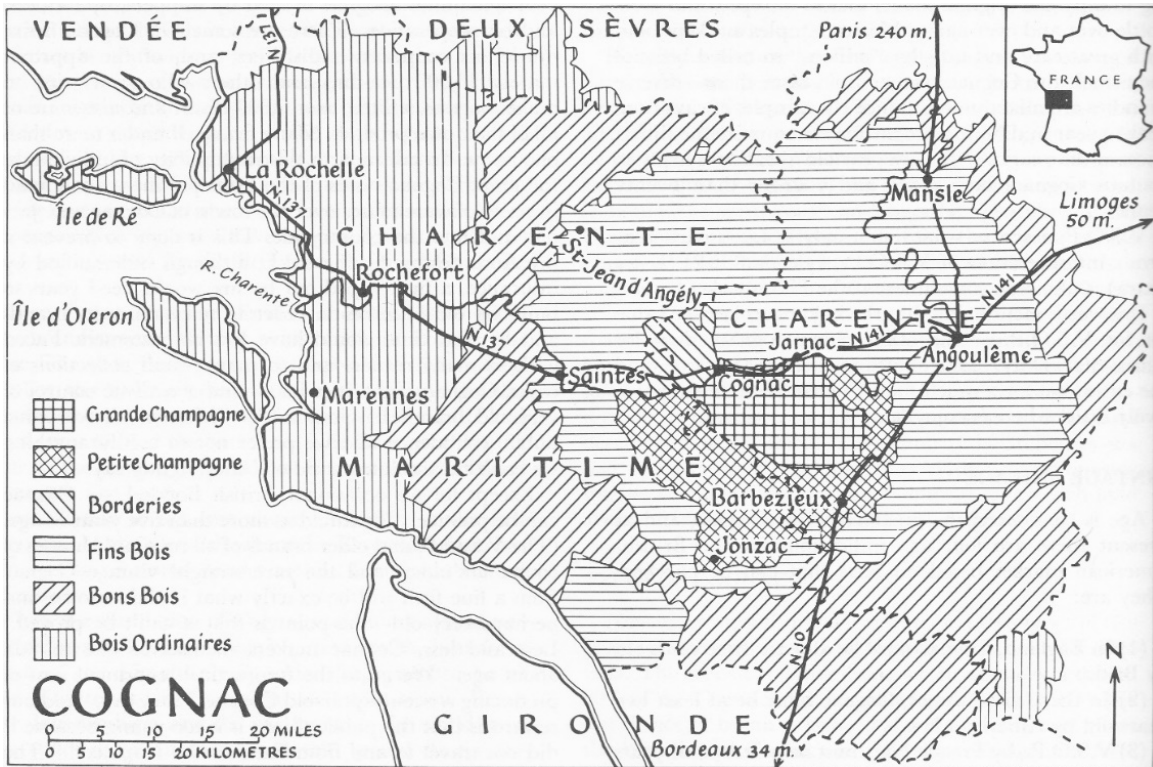


COGNAC BRANDYWINE

GRANDE CHAMPAGNE	Considered by many to be the best Cognac region, especially by those favoring smooth, refined, flavor.
BORDERIES	Considered by some to be the best Cognac region, especially by those favoring richer flavor.
PETITE CHAMPAGNE	Rarely bottled under its own name, this brandywine has character like that of Grande Champagne, but less refined.
CHAMPAGNE OR FINE CHAMPAGNE	This is usually either Petite Champagne, or a blend of grapes from Petite Champagne and Grande Champagne
FINS BOIS	Rarely bottled alone, these grapes mostly end up in such products that bear no sub-regional name.
BON BOIS	Rarely bottled alone, these grapes mostly end up in such products that bear no sub-regional name.
BOIS ORDINAIRES	Rarely bottled alone, these grapes mostly end up in such products that bear no sub-regional name.
<no region stated>	Often a blend of grapes from the less-favored regions, common for brands like Hennessy or Courvoisier.
